Course Title: Screen Acting Year Course

Duration: 12 months

Study: 11 hours a week course and independent study.

Delivery method: On-site study (part time), supplemented with homework and individual study (part time)

Cost: £9,495.00 (instalment plan available)

Overview

To develop an understanding of acting techniques in relation to screen acting, and build your confidence as an actor. Enable you to produce and generate your own work, and understand the professional requirements expected of you.

First 6 Months

The focus of first half of the course will be for participants to develop their own 'Toolbox' approach. Rather than study just one technique, The Reel Scene approach is for you to create your own bespoke technique to acting. The course will give you a strong grounding in a three-pronged approach covering Stanislavski's 'Active Analysis', the Meisner approach and Michael Chekov's 'Psychological Gesture'.

Second 6 Months

The focus of the second half will move to the business side of acting, looking at how to make the acting industry work to your strengths. Learn how to market yourself, get in the room, use social media, film successful showreel scenes and generating your own work. There will be seminars and classes led by industry professionals to help you make the most of your talent.

Throughout the year

During the full 12 months, you will regularly have the opportunity to dedicate days to shooting in front of camera when you are ready, building scenes culminating in your own short film. We will support your film in submissions to festivals, and help you build your network to boost your profile too. We will also help you consider the different career opportunities available to you.
